AFFIDAVIT OF ERIC COLE

I, Eric Cole, of Ashburn, Virginia, MAKE OATH and SAY:

- 1. I am a court-acknowledged expert in information technology, with a focus on cyber security, secure network design, perimeter defense, penetration testing, vulnerability discovery and intrusion detection systems. My education includes a doctorate degree in information technology from Pace University and master's and bachelor's degrees in computer science from the New York Institute of Technology.
- 2. I served as a Commissioner on Cyber Security for President Obama and have served on several other executive advisory boards. I am the author of many books about computer network design and cyber security including Online Danger, Advanced Persistent Threat, Hackers Beware, Hiding in Plain Site, Network Security Bible, and Insider Threat. At SANS Technology Institute I am a faculty fellow and course author.
- 3. My past employment included positions of Chief Technology Officer of McAfee, Chief Scientist for Lockheed Martin and ten years with the Central Intelligence Agency.
- 4. I have previously testified or provided sworn written evidence to many courts and have been accepted as an expert witness.
- 5. As an expert witness, I am aware that I serve only the truth and the court no matter how I am compensated. I jealously guard my independence and integrity.
- 6. My complete CV is attached to my affidavit as EXHIBIT A.
- 7. Retainer and Task

- 8. I was retained by lawyer Paul Slansky to examine certain records, exhibits and other evidence having to do with apparent internet investigations and activities by persons using the computer network of the Federal Court of Canada to visit the DonaldBest.CA website.
- 9. Mr. Slansky asked me to verify the accuracy of the 'StatCounter' activity records of visits to his client's website, DonaldBest.CA, and to offer an expert opinion on the events and issues raised in a series of communications between Mr. Slansky, the Federal Court of Canada ('FCC') and the Courts Administration Service ('CAS').

10. Observations

- 11. After examining various logs, records and documents which are attached as exhibits to this affidavit, my observations and conclusions are as follows:
- 12. The computer network used by the Federal Court of Canada, as maintained by the Courts Administration Service ('CAS'), is a sophisticated Canada-wide computer network that is professionally engineered, managed and maintained by a team of managers, engineers and technicians across Canada. Publicly-available lists of Canadian federal employees include CAS employees grouped under 'Network Services and Infrastructure' with titles such as 'Accounts Administrator', 'Network Technician', 'Network Architecture Engineer' and 'Manager Infrastructure & Operations'. (EXHIBIT B List of CAS IT Employees) (EXHIBIT C List of FCC / CAS offices nationwide) Published CAS Audit Reports provide further indications of the size, sophistication and professional management of the CAS Information Technology section and networks. (EXHIBIT D CAS Internal audit of Program Integrity.), (EXHIBIT E CAS Audit of Integrated Risk Management.)
- 13. As with any such professional network, and especially a network used by the justice system and courts of a sovereign nation, I expect that certain industry-standard protocols will be in place, including managed access to the network and the maintaining of network logs and records for various operational, technical and security purposes. It is also expected that there are appropriate security policies in place governing proper use of the network.
- 14. Managed access to the network ensures that only authorized persons are able to use the network and that their network activities are restricted according to their duties and needs. At a minimum, I expect that all authorized users of the FCC network including judges and court staff would have individual user accounts and passwords rather than group accounts and passwords. Further, each connected device (computer, tablet, phone, copier) carries its own unique identifiers, including a device serial number and MAC number etc, which I expect is logged for various purposes.
- 15. I am confident that Courts Administration Service's 'Network Services and Infrastructure' employees could have or already used their network logs and records to know which individual FCC network access accounts were used to visit the DonaldBest.CA website during the dates and times indicated in Mr. Slansky's letters to the FCC and CAS. The network employees also know the serial number and MAC address of each FCC-issued

computer, who the computer was assigned to and which person / account was using the computer at the time of each visit to DonaldBest.CA

- 16. I believe that the CAS would have already performed internal assessments to know which user accounts were involved as it would be a natural first step upon receiving Mr. Slansky's first letter. As well, the reply letters from Deputy Chief Administrator Chantal Carbonneau indicate knowledge that at least one of the visits to DonaldBest.CA was made by the CAS Security Department. This revelation itself confirms that an investigation was performed by CAS in response to Mr. Slansky's initial January 8, 2018 letter as anyone would expect. (EXHIBIT F January 8, 2018 letter Paul Slansky to FCC) (EXHIBITS L, O, P Letters from CAS Chantal Carbonneau to Slansky)
- 17. I note that Mr. Slansky instructed in his January 8, 2018, January 31, 2018 and April 1, 2018 letters to the court, that all data and records were to be fully and properly preserved by the court. I presume that this has been done as is standard industry practice when such notifications are received, especially in the midst of an ongoing legal action. (EXHIBITS F, K, Q Slansky letters to FCC, CAS)
- 18. Even if such data and records were not preserved (and I can only speculate why they would not be preserved), there exists in any large network, locations and devices where secondary records are routinely maintained that can also be used to track access to the network. Further, each computer or other device accessing the network maintains records and has 'hidden' data – the professional examination of which can reveal the history of use, including websites visited. In the current case, I do not doubt that the computers or other devices used by FCC judges, staff and/or other personnel to visit DonaldBest.CA would contain records and evidence of such visits unless such information was deliberately erased or the staff was negligent in maintaining the systems.
- 19. In short, it is my professional and considered expert opinion that the Courts Administration Service knows the individual network user accounts and the devices used by FCC personnel to visit DonaldBest.CA – and that the CAS knows the identities of the individuals who used the FCC network to visit DonaldBest.CA website on the dates and times in question.

20. Visits to DonaldBest.CA website from the FCC Network

- 21. As indicated in Mr. Slansky's letters, I confirm that persons with access to the computer network of the Federal Court of Canada, did make numerous online visits to the DonaldBest.ca website between July 15, 2016 and March 15, 2018. (I explain the supporting evidence and process that I used to come to this expert conclusion in a later section of my affidavit titled "DonaldBest.CA 'StatCounter' visitor logs".)
- 22. All of these known FCC visitors arrived at the DonaldBest.CA website after searching 'Google' or 'Bing' search engines with terms and/or words that led them to articles on the website dealing specifically with the legal case and people before the Federal Court of

Canada in the case 'Donald Best and Attorney General of Canada and The Honourable Mr. Justice J. Bryan Shaughnessy', FCC Case T-604-16.

- 23. After arrival at the DonaldBest.CA website, the FCC visitors primarily read articles dealing with the FCC legal case and involved persons, rather than other articles on the website devoted to other subjects.
- 24. In comparing the dates of FCC visits with the FCC-provided list of 'Proceedings Queries' for the case (EXHIBIT R FCC Proceedings Queries for T-604-16, Donald Best v. AGC et al), I note that many of the FCC visits happened on or near dates that are listed concerning the case before the court. (EXHIBITS I, J StatCounter Visits Logs for IP 198.103.145.50)
- 25. For instance, the FFC 'Proceedings Queries' list shows that November 20, 2017 was a hearing day before The Honourable Mr. Justice Boswell, with Frank Kurina as Court Senior Usher. On that day, the DonaldBest.CA logs show FCC visits at 8:59am, 9:01am, 9:33am, 9:52am, 1:35pm and 1:36pm (Eastern) using Windows 7 computers and Internet Explorer and Chrome browsers. I note that Mr. Slansky's January 31, 2018 letter to the CAS (EXHIBIT K) details how both he and his client observed the judge (Justice Boswell) operating his computer from the bench during the November 20, 2017 hearing. Mr. Slansky asks if it might be possible that the judge's computer was accessing the internet during the hearing.
- 26. My answer to Mr. Slansky's question is that yes, FCC personnel accessed the DonaldBest.CA website during the November 20, 2017 hearing and it is possible that Justice Boswell did so from the bench. The Courts Administration Service, however, has the logs and electronic evidence to know the truth about whether any of the November 20, 2017 FCC visits came from Justice Boswell's computer, just as they know the FCC user accounts that visited the DonaldBest.CA website on each of the logged dates and times from July 15, 2016 to the present day.
- 27. As well as the November 20, 2017 FCC visits to DonaldBest.CA there are other notable visits listed, such as:
- 28. The 'Proceedings Queries' list shows that Prothonotary Mandy Aylen rendered an order on July 15, 2016. The visitor logs indicate that early in the day at 7:42am and 8:34am, someone used the FCC network to visit DonaldBest.CA and read the article 'Judge J. Bryan Shaughnessy under investigation by Canadian Judicial Council'
- 29. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on August 19, 2016, Chief Justice Crampton Matter considered the case, but two days previously many FCC visits were made to DonaldBest.CA again reading articles pertaining to the case before the FCC and also downloading evidence posted online.
- 30. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on October 11, 2016 from 12pm to 12:30pm, there was a Case Management Conference before Prothonotary Mandy Aylen.

About an hour before the conference at 11:04am, someone from the FCC visited DonaldBest.CA and read about lawyer Paul Slansky and other relevant articles.

- 31. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on December 20, 2016, a hearing was held before Prothonotary Mandy Aylen. In the five days before the hearing, four incidents happened where FCC network users visited DonaldBest.CA, searched for and read materials about the case before the FCC.
- 32. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on May 8, 2017, lawyer Paul Slansky requested a hearing. On that date, person(s) used the FCC network in the late afternoon to visit DonaldBest.CA where they searched for and read articles dealing with the case.
- 33. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on October 20, 2017, a hearing was held from 9:30am to 1pm before Prothonotary Mandy Aylen to consider a motion by proposed intervenor Julian Fantino. On October 16, 2017 for about an hour, FCC visitors reviewed articles about the case at DonaldBest.CA.
- 34. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on November 6, 2017, Julian Fantino filed a Notice of Motion for an Appeal of the previous decision by Prothonotary Mandy Aylen. On the same day, November 6, 2017, person(s) from the FCC visited DonaldBest.CA website and researched/read articles about the case before the FCC including 'Court denies former Ontario Provincial Police Commissioner Julian Fantino intervention in Judicial Review of CJC DonaldBest.CA'
- 35. Similarly, I see in the 'Proceedings Queries' that on November 16, 2017, The Honourable Mr. Justice Boswell directed about proposed intervenor Julian Fantino: "The proposed intervener's Notice of Motion for an appeal in respect of the order of Case Management Judge Aylen issued on October 25, 2017, should be scheduled for General Sittings and will not be heard at the hearing of the Applicant's Application for Judicial Review scheduled to commence next Monday, November 20, 2017." On the same day, November 16, 2017, person(s) from the FCC visited DonaldBest.CA website and researched/read articles about the case before the FCC including an article titled 'Comparing two Canadian Judges: 'Knees Together Robin Camp' vs 'Backroom Bryan Shaughnessy'
- 36. With each of the above examples, and with every FCC visit to the DonaldBest.CA website, the CAS/FCC knows the identities of the person(s) using the FCC network to visit DonaldBest.CA.

37. DonaldBest.CA 'StatCounter' visitor logs

38. The DonaldBest.CA website is hosted at GoDaddy.com and uses the WordPress Content Management system to enable Mr. Best to post articles, photos and videos on the web. GoDaddy is a larger reputable hosting providing and would maintain accurate logs for the sites they host.

- 39. The DonaldBest.CA website uses the 'StatCounter' service to track, log and preserve detailed information about visits and visitors to the website. Mr. Best uses the paid upgrade version which allows for larger log sizes to be preserved by the StatCounter company.
- 40. It is important to note that StatCounter clients/users like Mr. Best cannot change any of the online visitor information stored and maintained by StatCounter. Users can access and download copies of their website's StatCounter data, but if they changed any of the downloaded data, for instance by adding visits that never happened or removing visits this would be instantly detectable upon comparison with the original data held by StatCounter.
- 41. I have personally examined the online original DonaldBest.CA visitor data collected and preserved by StatCounter and compared it to the DonaldBest.CA website 'StatCounter' visitor logs as included in Mr. Slansky's communications with the court and attached as exhibits to my affidavit. I attest that the DonaldBest.CA visitor logs in Mr. Slansky's letters are accurate presentations of original data still held and preserved by StatCounter.
- 42. The StatCounter visitor logs collect and show an array of information for each visit, including:

Date and Time of visit IP Address of visitor Browser used (Chrome, iPhone, Internet Explorer, Safari, FireFox etc) Browser Version Operating System (Windows, iOS, Linux, Mac etc) Screen Resolution Country Region City Postal Code ISP (Internet Service Provider) URL arrived upon Page Title (Article title) Came from (Visitor arrived from) Search Engine Name (Google, Bing etc) Search Engine Host

- 43. In the case of IP (Internet Protocol Number) 198.103.145.50, shown in EXHIBIT G (WhoIS search IP results for 198.103.145.50), as attached to Paul Slansky's January 8, 2018 letter, the IP number was assigned to the Canadian Government Telecommunications and Informatics Services Federal Court of Canada.
- 44. I note that the January 17, 2018 letter from Chantal Carbonneau to Paul Slansky indicates that, as a result of Mr. Slansky's January 8, 2018 letter, the Courts Administration Service intended to change the IP address information to reflect a new policy where the IP number can be used by any of four courts, including the Federal Court of Canada.

45. This change simply doesn't matter, as the CAS knows from its records and logs exactly who used the network on the dates and times in question to access DonaldBest.CA.

46. Observation re IP #198.103.245.2

- 47. I note that Paul Slansky's January 31, 2018 letter to the CAS states that visits to DonaldBest.CA from IP: 198.103.245.2 took place on October 19, 2017 and January 10, 2018. I confirm that the StatCounter records show these visits taking place as stated by Mr. Slansky and that the IP number resolves to an assignment to 'Shared Services Canada' with a resolve host of 'mail.judicom.gc.ca'. 'Judicom' seems to indicate a judicial email server, but once again, the CAS likely knows the entire story in detail, based upon their records and resources. (EXHIBIT S StatCounter Visitor Summary for 198.103.245.2) (EXHIBIT T WhoIS record for IP 198.103.245.2)
- 48. I also note that the visitors used the Google search engine to arrive at DonaldBest.CA, and once at the website viewed articles and downloaded exhibits having to do exclusively with the case before the FCC.

49. Observation re Durham Regional Police Investigation and IP #66.163.5.113

- 50. I note that in his January 31, 2018 letter, lawyer Paul Slansky refers to the Canadian Judicial Council judicial review case having a history of secret and improper investigations by police.
- 51. Attached to my affidavit are the following Exhibits:
- 52. EXHIBIT U is a June 15, 2016 letter from lawyer Paul Slansky to Chief Paul Martin of the Durham Regional Police Service, including attachments showing StatCounter visitor logs to DonaldBest.CA website from IP 66.163.5.113.
- 53. EXHIBIT V is an Excel Spreadsheet of StatCounter-sourced list of visits to DonaldBest.CA from IP 66.163.5.113 (On data CD)
- 54. EXHIBIT W is StatCounter summary of visits to DonaldBest.CA from IP 66.163.5.113
- 55. EXHIBIT X is a 'WhoIs' report for IP 66.163.5.11, showing assignment to the Durham Regional Police.
- 56. EXHIBIT Y is a June 30, 2016 response letter from Inspector Mark Morissette of the Durham Regional Police Service.
- 57. As with the visits to DonaldBest.CA by FCC personnel, I have personally examined the online original DonaldBest.CA visitor data collected and preserved by StatCounter and compared it to the DonaldBest.CA website 'StatCounter' visitor logs as included in Mr. Slansky's communications with the Durham Regional Police and attached as exhibits to my affidavit. I attest that the DonaldBest.CA visitor logs in Mr. Slansky's letter to the

Durham Regional Police are accurate presentations of the original data still held and preserved by StatCounter. Further, the data indicates visits from the Durham Regional Police computer network to DonaldBest.CA website on the dates and times indicated.

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

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



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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 Background

Risk management has been identified as a key component of modern management in the Canadian federal government for over a decade, and consequently CAS identified the need to conduct an audit of Integrated Risk Management in its risk-based audit plan.

A multi-year internal audit plan for fiscal years 2014-15 to 2020-21 indicated that the risk associated with Integrated Risk Management was ranked as low. As a result, Samson and Associates was retained to conduct an audit of Integrated Risk Management.

1.2 Audit Objectives and Scope

The objective of the audit was to provide reasonable assurance that the Department's Integrated Risk Management (IRM) Framework and its practices are adequate and are being implemented. Adequacy is defined based on the Department's compliance with the Treasury Board (TB) Framework for the Management of Risk and related leading practices. As further detailed in the audit criteria in Appendix B, the scope of the audit included the following three lines of inquiry:

- IRM governance (to provide oversight of the IRM process)
- IRM processes (to identify, assess and respond to risks)
- IRM monitoring and reporting (to monitor and report on the state of risks on a regular basis)

1.3 Acknowledgment

The Audit Team would like to acknowledge the collaboration they have received from all interviewees, and in particular the support of the A/Director, Corporate Secretariat.

1.4 Audit Findings and Recommendations

Three (3) observed strengths and 4 (four) key recommendations are presented in numerical sequence and aligned with Section 1.5 – Management Response and Action Plan, and Section 2 – Detailed Report.

Observed Strengths

The following strengths related to Integrated Risk Management were observed during the audit:

- 1. An effective governance structure has been designed for Integrated Risk Management that helps ensure all senior officials and Chief Justices are consulted with regards to identifying and assessing enterprise-level risks.
- 2. Executive sponsorship of Integrated Risk Management is strong and helps set the tone at the top on the importance of risk management for the organization.

3. An Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Framework has been developed to detail the risk management process, to clarify roles and responsibilities, to highlight the three corporate risks and high level mitigation measures, and to provide risk management-related tools to the organization.

Finding 1 - Corporate Risk Profile Updates

Key Findings

We found that the risk related to "Access to Justice" is monitored on a regular basis through the budgeting and forecasting process and other means; and that risks related to IT and security are monitored through regular updates at the Executive Committee (ExCom) on specific activities and projects. While these specific activities or projects may serve to mitigate the IT or security risks, it was not readily apparent to most interviewees how they related to the Corporate Risk Profile, and how they influenced the overall risk level for the organization. As a result, most interviewees felt that they did not have an adequate indication of how the IT and security risks had evolved throughout the year, since the Corporate Risk Profile was prepared. The ERM Framework contains a sample Quarterly Risk Mitigation Progress Report which could be further leveraged by risk owners to provide updates on risk mitigation activities, risk indicators and risk trends to help senior management more readily understand how corporate risks evolve throughout the year. This may be in part due to the fact that the role and responsibilities of the risk owner are not well understood (refer to section 3.6).

The lack of regular updates to the Corporate Risk Profile limits senior management's ability to understand how risks evolve during the year and to take corrective actions in a timely manner if required. Using risk indicators helps better quantify the assessment of risks which could otherwise be subjective in nature, and helps to identify risk trends during the year.

Recommendation

1. The Chief Administrator should ensure that Corporate Risk Profile progress reports are presented by risk owners on a regular basis, and that such reports are supported by tangible risk indicators to help quantify risks and identify risk trends during the year.

Finding 2 - Risk Identification Process

Key Findings

We found that the risk consultation process is broad and includes the Executive Committee, the Senior Management Committee, the Chief Justices Steering Committee and the Audit Committee. Stakeholders are asked to validate previously identified risks, and to identify if other risks should be considered by leveraging a risk taxonomy that identifies other potential sources of risk for CAS; however, the taxonomy does not have certain risk categories found on the TBS risk taxonomy guide that appear relevant to CAS, including values and ethics, communications and capital infrastructure. In addition, risks that are not considered a top corporate risk are not formally identified and assessed.

If the risk taxonomy is not complete or current, there is a risk that stakeholders may not readily identify risks that are most relevant to the organization. If risks that are not considered a top corporate risk are not

formally identified and assessed, senior management's visibility into emerging risks will be limited. Emerging risks may not require the same level of senior management attention, but monitoring of these risks is recommended to proactively manage risks.

Recommendation

2. The Chief Administrator should ensure that the risk taxonomy is updated and reviewed on a regular basis, and that the assessment of risk is expanded beyond the top three corporate risks.

Finding 3-Risk Management in Operational Plans

Key Findings

We found that risk management is fully embedded into the strategic planning process. For example, the Annual Report and the Report on Plans and Priorities include considerations for strategic risks. We also found that risk management is embedded into the organization's project management framework. From an operational planning perspective, the budgeting process takes a risk-based approach to funding allocation decisions; however, we found that risk management has not been embedded into operational plans. Not all areas have developed an operational plan, and for those areas that have such a plan, risk management is not formally embedded into the plan.

If risk management is not formally embedded into operational plans, there is an increased risk that operational priorities may not sufficiently be risk-based.

Recommendation

3. The Chief Administrator should ensure that risk management is embedded into operational plans

Finding 4 - Risk Management Training and Awareness

Key Findings

We found that stakeholders are generally aware of the importance of risk management within the organization. Most interviewees were aware of the corporate risks, but some confusion remained in terms of roles and responsibilities for risk owners and for managing risk mitigation actions throughout operational areas and regions. Risk management awareness was generally lower amongst stakeholders not involved in one of the key governance committees. No specific training and awareness plan has been developed.

If the role of the risk owner is not clear, there is an increased risk that risks will not be proactively managed. Similarly, broad awareness of corporate risks and the benefits of risk management helps ensure that actions posed by employees throughout the organization are aligned with risks.

Recommendation

4. The Chief Administrator should ensure that the role of risk owners is clarified and that a plan be developed to provide risk management training and awareness to stakeholders based

on their roles and responsibilities. For example, specific training should be developed on the role and responsibilities of risk owners.

1.5 Executive Summary of Management Response

Management agrees with all recommendations made in this report. Appropriate detailed action plans will be developed and implemented.

1.6 Conclusion

Overall, the audit found that the Department's Integrated Risk Management (IRM) Framework and its practices are adequate, with moderate areas for improvement identified related to corporate risk profile updates, risk identification, risk management in operational plans, and risk management training and awareness.

1.7 Statement of Conformance

In my professional judgment, sufficient and appropriate audit procedures have been conducted and evidence gathered to support the accuracy of the conclusion provided and contained in this report. The conclusion is based on a comparison of the conditions, as they existed at the time, against pre-established review criteria that were agreed upon with management. The conclusion is applicable only to the entity examined. The evidence was gathered in compliance with Treasury Board policies, directives and standards on internal audit and conforms to the Internal Auditing Standards for the Government of Canada. The evidence gathered was sufficient to provide senior management with proof of the conclusion derived from the review engagement. A practice inspection has not been conducted on the operations of the Internal Audit function.

2 DETAILED REPORT

2.1 Background

As stated in the Treasury Board Guide to Integrated Risk Management, risk management is recognized as a core element of effective public administration. In a dynamic and complex environment, organizations require the capacity to recognize, understand, accommodate and capitalize on new challenges and opportunities. The effective management of risk contributes to improved decision-making, better allocation of resources and, ultimately, better results for Canadians.

Risk management has been identified as a key component of modern management in the Canadian federal government for over a decade, and consequently CAS identified the need to conduct an audit of Integrated Risk Management in its risk-based audit plan.

A multi-year internal audit plan for fiscal years 2014-15 to 2020-21 indicated that the risk associated with Integrated Risk Management was ranked as low. As a result, Samson and Associates was retained to conduct an audit of Integrated Risk Management.

2.2 Audit Objective

The objective of the audit was to provide reasonable assurance that the Department's Integrated Risk Management (IRM) Framework and its practices are adequate and are being implemented. Adequacy is defined based on the Department's compliance with the Treasury Board (TB) Framework for the Management of Risk and related leading practices.

2.3 Scope

The scope of the audit included the following three lines of inquiry:

- IRM governance (to provide oversight of the IRM process)
- IRM processes (to identify, assess and respond to risks)
- IRM monitoring and reporting (to monitor and report on the state of risks on a regular basis)

2.4 Methodology

In support of the requirements under *TB Policy on Internal Audit*, audit criteria for each of the three lines of inquiry was derived from the Treasury Board Framework for the Management of Risk and related leading practices. Audit Criteria can be found in Appendix B.

A risk-based audit program was developed to provide additional details on how the audit objective will be addressed, and makes reference to specific audit procedures including:

- Review of IRM deliverables and other key artefacts, including the Corporate Risk Profile, the Report on Plans and Priorities and the Annual Report
- Review of policies, procedures, tools and templates related to IRM;
- Review of IRM governance committee meeting minutes;
- · Review of a sample of the output of project management activities; and,
- Interviews with IRM stakeholders throughout CAS.

The list of interviewees can be found in Appendix A. The work for this project was substantially completed in May 2015.

2.5 Overview of the IRM Process

The IRM process is managed by the Director, Corporate Secretariat, with the direct support of the Senior Advisor, Strategic Planning and Reporting. As at the time of the audit, the Senior Advisor is acting in the Director role, and no replacement has been identified to temporarily backfill the Senior Advisor role.

CAS has implemented a top down approach to the identification of key corporate risks in the 2015-16 Corporate Risk Profile (CRP). The approach involves consultations with senior governance committees within CAS to confirm if the risks identified in the previous year are still key risks for CAS, and to identify if other risks should also be considered. The following committees are consulted:

- The Executive Committee;
- The Senior Management Committee;
- The Chief Justices Steering Committee; and
- The Departmental Audit Committee.

In reviewing risks, committee members are asked to assess the likelihood and impact of each risk in order to help determine if they are still key risks for the organisation. Rating scales for both likelihood and impact are used to facilitate the process. Similarly, committee members are asked to identify if other risks should be considered, and a risk taxonomy defining various categories of risk is used to facilitate the process.

Once confirmed, the key risks form part of the CRP, and a risk reporting and communications grid is available to guide the approach to monitor the risks, with the top-most risks expected to require detailed management planning and attention.

Risk information is also embedded in the Report on Plans and Priorities and in the Annual Report published by the organization. Finally, an Enterprise Risk Management Framework has been developed by the organization. The Framework provides an overview of the risk management process, an environmental scan and analysis of significant risk drivers, a description of the three most significant corporate risks and related risk mitigation measures, a description of risk management roles and responsibilities, and various tools to help the organization consistently assess risks and identify a risk response strategy.

3 FINDINGS, RECOMMENDATIONS AND MANAGEMENT RESPONSE

3.1 Introduction

This section presents observed strengths and detailed findings from the audit of Integrated Risk Management. Findings are based on the evidence and analysis from both our initial risk analysis and the detailed audit.

3.2 Observed Strengths

The following strengths related to Integrated Risk Management were observed during the audit:

- 1. An effective governance structure has been designed for Integrated Risk Management that helps ensure all senior officials and Chief Justices are consulted with regards to identifying and assessing enterprise-level risks.
- 2. Executive sponsorship of Integrated Risk Management is strong and helps set the tone at the top on the importance of risk management for the organization.
- **3.** An Enterprise risk Management Framework has been developed to detail the risk management process, to clarify roles and responsibilities, to highlight the three corporate risks and high level mitigation measures, and to provide risk management-related tools to the organization.

3.3 Finding 1 - Corporate Risk Profile Updates

- 3.3.1 We expected to find an effective process in place for risk owners to monitor and report on risks mitigation plans of the Corporate Risk Profile on an on-going basis, supported by adequate risk indicators and trends to support informed risk-based decision making.
- 3.3.2 We found that the risk related to "Access to Justice" is monitored on a regular basis through the budgeting and forecasting process and other means; and that risks related to IT and security are monitored through regular updates at ExCom on specific activities and projects. While these specific activities or projects may serve to mitigate the IT or security risks, it was not readily apparent to most interviewees how they related to the Corporate Risk Profile, and how they influenced the overall risk level for the organization. As a result, most interviewees felt that they did not have an adequate indication of how the IT and security risks had evolved throughout the year, since the Corporate Risk Profile was prepared. The ERM Framework contains a sample Quarterly Risk Mitigation Progress Report which could be further leveraged by risk owners to provide updates on risk mitigation activities, risk indicators and risk trends to help senior management more readily

understand how corporate risks evolve throughout the year. This may be in part due to the fact that the role and responsibilities of the risk owner are not well understood (refer to section 3.6).

3.3.3 The lack of regular updates to the Corporate Risk Profile limits senior management's ability to understand how risks evolve during the year and to take corrective actions in a timely manner if required. Using risk indicators helps better quantify the assessment of risks which could otherwise be subjective in nature, and helps to identify risk trends during the year.

Recommendation

1. The Chief Administrator should ensure that Corporate Risk Profile progress reports are presented by risk owners on a regular basis, and that such reports are supported by tangible risk indicators to help quantify risks and identify risk trends during the year.

Management Response - Recommendation 1

1. Management agrees with this recommendation. The Corporate Risk Profile progress reports will be linked with the financial quarterly reviews.

3.4 Finding 2 - Risk Identification Process

- 3.4.1 We expected to find an effective process to identify risks based on a defined risk universe/taxonomy, an internal and external environmental scan, and consultations with stakeholders across the organization to help identify risks that are relevant to the organization.
- 3.4.2 We found that the risk consultation process is broad and includes the Executive Committee, the Senior Management Committee, the Chief Justices Steering Committee and the Audit Committee. Stakeholders are asked to validate previously identified risks, and to identify if other risks should be considered by leveraging a risk taxonomy that identifies other potential sources of risk for CAS; however, the taxonomy does not have certain risk categories found on the TBS risk taxonomy guide that appear relevant to CAS, including values and ethics, communications and capital infrastructure. In addition, risks that are not considered a top corporate risk are not formally identified and assessed.
- 3.4.3 If the risk taxonomy is not complete or current, there is a risk that stakeholders may not readily identify risks that are most relevant to the organization. If risks that are not considered a top corporate risk are not formally identified and assessed, senior management's visibility into emerging risks will be limited. Emerging risks may not require the same level of senior management attention, but monitoring of these risks is recommended to proactively manage risks.

Recommendation

2. The Chief Administrator should ensure that the risk taxonomy is updated and reviewed on a regular basis, and that the assessment of risk is expanded beyond the top three corporate risks.

Management Response - Recommendation 2

2. Management agrees with this recommendation. A full review and update of the risk taxonomy will be incorporated into the next round of the risk assessment process (2016-17) and every three years thereafter.

3.5 Finding 3 - Risk Management in Operational Plans

- 3.5.1 We expected to find risk management embedded into strategic, operational and project planning processes.
- 3.5.2 We found that risk management is fully embedded into the strategic planning process. For example, the Annual Report and the Report on Plans and Priorities include considerations for strategic risks. We also found that risk management is embedded into the organization's project management framework. From an operational planning perspective, the budgeting process takes a risk-based approach to funding allocation decisions; however, we found that risk management has not been embedded into operational plans. Not all areas have developed an operational plan, and for those areas that have such a plan, risk management is not formally embedded into the plan.
- 3.5.3 If risk management is not formally embedded into operational plans, there is an increased risk that operational priorities may not sufficiently be risk-based.

Recommendation

3. The Chief Administrator should ensure that risk management is embedded into operational plans.

Management Response - Recommendation 3

3. Management agrees with this recommendation. Moving forward, CAS will ensure that risk management is embedded into all operational plans. The targeted date for compliance will be set for March 31, 2017.

3.6 Finding 4 - Risk Management Training and Awareness

- 3.6.1 We expected to find a general awareness of corporate risks and a plan to provide training and awareness to risk management stakeholders based on their roles and responsibilities
- 3.6.2 We found that stakeholders are generally aware of the importance of risk management within the organization. Most interviewees were aware of the corporate risks, but some confusion remained in terms of roles and responsibilities for risk owners and for managing risk mitigation actions throughout operational areas and regions. Risk management awareness was generally lower amongst stakeholders not involved in one of the key governance committees. No specific training and awareness plan has been developed.
- 3.6.3 If the role of the risk owner is not clear, there is an increased risk that risks will not be proactively managed. Similarly, broad awareness of corporate risks and the benefits of risk management helps ensure that actions posed by employees throughout the organization are aligned with risks.

Recommendation

4. The Chief Administrator should ensure that the role of risk owners is clarified and that a plan be developed to provide risk management training and awareness to stakeholders based on their roles and responsibilities. For example, specific training should be developed on the role and responsibilities of risk owners.

Management Response - Recommendation 4

4. Management agrees with this recommendation. Plans for risk management training for risk owners and stakeholders will be developed by December 2015 and training will be delivered by December 31, 2016. The training will clarify the roles and responsibilities of risk owners and increase stakeholders' risk awareness based on their roles and responsibilities.

My client, Donald Best, has been a litigant in the Federal Court of Canada ("FCC") in the above-noted Application for Judicial Review filed April 14, 2016. Most recently the Judicial Review was heard over two days on November 20 & 21, 2017 before The Honourable Mr. Justice Keith Boswell, with Justice Boswell's decision being released on December 14, 2017.

My client recently became aware that a person or persons of the Federal Court of Canada performed extensive online research into my client's judicial review application, the underlying case and the involved litigants and witnesses throughout the judicial review case from at least July 15, 2016 to December 7, 2017. Documents that make this clear are attached.

My client is aware of this because the visitor records for his DonaldBest.CA website show dozens of visits from IP (Internet Protocol Number) 198.103.145.50, which is permanently assigned to the Federal Court of Canada. ('WhoIs' search attached.)

Records show that the Federal Court of Canada visitor(s) to DonaldBest.CA spent many hours over many days and months reading articles, opinion pieces and downloading documents that exclusively had to do with the judicial review before the court, the underlying case, court exhibits and various parties and witnesses including Donald Best, Justice J. Bryan Shaughnessy, Julian Fantino, Norman Sabourin, The Canadian Judicial Council, Gerald Ranking, Lorne Silver, Sebastien Kwidzinski, OPP detective Jim Van Allen, myself Paul Slansky and others.

Sometimes the FCC visitor(s) would arrive directly at my client's website indicating that they typed the URL (i.e.: 'donaldbest.ca') into their browser or had it bookmarked. On other occasions, the FCC visitor(s) arrived through online search engines such as Google or Bing etc. during part of a process that appears to have involved extensive online research into my client's Judicial Review application and the associated parties and witnesses – not only at my client's website but others as well.

For instance: my client's website records (attached) indicate that on November 20, 2017, the first day of the Judicial Review before Justice Boswell, Federal Court of Canada person(s) accessed articles and documents about the judicial review shortly before the court commenced, during court and during the lunch break – as well on the day after the hearing ended.

Due to the natural limitations of visitor data collection, my client is unable to determine which Federal Court of Canada judge, judges and/or staff visited his website during the hearing and at other times.

In the interest of transparency and as information that may be relevant to an appeal that is about to be filed by me on behalf of my client, I hereby request that you have the Federal Court of Canada IT Internet Technology personnel deliver to me as soon as possible, the following information:

- The dates and times of all Federal Court access to DonaldBest.ca and other websites containing information relating to my client's judicial review application and associated persons and entities.
- The MAC (Media Access Control) address number for each internet device used.
- The name of the person(s) logged into the Federal Court of Canada network and computers used to perform the online research.
- The reasons that each Federal Court of Canada person conducted the online research, what information was viewed and/or downloaded, to whom such information was distributed and how the information was eventually utilized.

I look forward to your reply. Please ensure that the Federal Court of Canada takes appropriate steps to preserve records and data in respect of these online investigations by FCC persons.



Thank you for your letter dated January 17, 2018. (attached hereto)

As this issue is of tremendous importance to everyone concerned with the administration of justice, we are pleased that the Courts Administration Service ("CAS") has begun to internally investigate the matter.

We appreciate that this is a complex, time-consuming investigation that has only just begun. It is apparent from your letter that the CAS is being advised by both court and technical staff, which seems to be a reasonable initial approach.

As you will recall in my January 8, 2018 letter, I made it clear that all records were to be fully and properly preserved. In that same letter, we requested that the following information be delivered to me as soon as possible:

- The dates and times of all Federal Court access to DonaldBest.ca and other websites containing information relating to my client's judicial review application and associated persons and entities.
- The MAC (Media Access Control) address number for each internet device used.

- The name of the person(s) logged into the Federal Court of Canada network and computers used to perform the online research.
- The reasons that each Federal Court of Canada person conducted the online research, what information was viewed and/or downloaded, to whom such information was distributed and how the information was eventually utilized.

This information has not yet been delivered to me, and we presume that the CAS is still in the process of gathering and confirming the facts as we requested. Please confirm that this is in process.

Also, please confirm that both an experienced general investigator and a senior network forensic investigator have been assigned to gather technical records and logs, to interview each of the individuals who performed the investigations of my client, his case and the proposed intervenor. IF so, I look forward to a report of the findings, analysis and conclusions.

My client and I would like to work with you and everyone concerned to make sure this matter is fully investigated and documented in a transparent manner.

Your general indication that persons using the court's computer network have been investigating my client, his case and other involved persons for a variety of reasons, including in the middle of a hearing, at the moment that lawyers were addressing the court, requires that we be informed of the full circumstances of each incident.

My client, who was sitting in the court during the November 20, 2017 hearing, and I noted that the judge was using his computer on the bench during the hearing. My client has asked me if it might be possible that the judge's computer was accessing the internet during the hearing. We also need to know whether the judge hearing the case accessed, directly or through the efforts of others, the information in advance of or after the hearing.

Further, my client notes that his DonaldBest.CA website records (as previously sent to you) indicate that the focus of the online investigations from the court included the judicial review before the court, the intervenor Julian Fantino, my client, me (Paul Slansky) and other persons involved in the judicial process before the court.

The fact that the CAS security department was involved in one or more of the incidents also causes concern as this civil case, that gave rise to the circumstances leading to the judicial review, has a history of secret and improper investigations by police.

Your letter informs us that the CAS has requested certain changes to the court's IP assignment records.

I am informed that the weekend after CAS received my January 8, 2018 letter, the Federal Court of Canada computer network, including the Federal Court of Canada's website, was

taken offline – from 8pm on Friday, January 12, 2018 to 6pm on Sunday, January 18, 2018.

I presume that this two-day network connectivity shutdown starting January 12, 2018 was part of the IP changes made to the Federal Court of Canada's internet access IP addresses that you describe.

Further, my client has recently discovered that his website records show further visits from another IP address associated with the FCC: 198.103.245.2 - apparently used for the FCC's email server 'mail.judicom.gc.ca'. (See attached visitor record.)

These visits from IP 198.103.245.2 took place on October 19, 2017 and January 10, 2018. As with the other noted FCC visits to my client's website, the visitors' web-searches and articles of interest concerned the case before the Federal Court of Canada – the Judicial Review of the CJC decision my client's complaint about Justice J. Bryan Shaughnessy.

With additional information surfacing every day, it would be efficient if we were able to speak directly with your general and technical investigators as the work progresses. I have no doubt that, as an award-winning investigator with several decades of experience in a broad variety of cases including internet investigations, my client would be an excellent resource for your personnel as they continue their investigations.

Please further advise the status of the CAS internal investigations and provide the contact information of the CAS general and technical investigation team so that we can open communications.

To keep this important investigation moving forward, I ask that we hear from you by Tuesday, February 6, 2018 and propose a regular and frequent exchange of information (perhaps weekly? every Tuesday?). Of course, as part of such an exchange, we would reciprocate and share relevant information that our investigations may reveal, as we have been doing to date.



Thank you for your letter dated March 29, 2018. I do not know why it took you 2 months to respond to my last letter. I had requested a response by February 6, 2018. This is especially concerning in light of the timing of your letter, having recently advised the Chief Justice of the FCA that this was an issue in a security for costs motion that is due on April 3. The nature of your letter does not suggest that any investigation or inquiries were being conducted in the last 2 months. I can only assume that the timing of your response relates to the timing of the security for costs motion.

Your response is unacceptable. In your January 17 letter, you say that your "understanding" was that the visits were made for "general information purposes" and provided two examples. The use of the word "understanding" suggests that your belief was based on something that you were told. We assumed that your understanding was merely a preliminary indication of what you believed was the situation, subject to investigation. You have repeated the same assertions in your March 29 letter, but no longer say that this is your "understanding". You have refused to further investigate the matter and have refused to provide the information sought.

The evidence provided to you is proof that persons from the Federal Court of Canada accessed my client's website in respect to portions of it dealing with the judicial review that was then before the Court. The suggestion that this might have been to obtain

contact information is absurd. The Court had no reason to contact my client and never has. The Court had my contact information. The suggestion that access might have been for security reasons is even more troubling. My client understandably has difficulty accepting that these were the reasons for the inquiries.


Only through access to this kind of information we have requested will we be able to determine whether the judge hearing the judicial review, or someone on his behalf, accessed material relevant to the judicial review during the judicial review. The nature of the online enquiries suggests that the interest was the subject matter of the judicial review. The subject of the inquiries included the judicial review before the court, the intervenor Julian Fantino, my client, me (Paul Slansky) and other persons involved in the judicial process before the court. The timing of the enquiries also suggests that this is a real possibility (i.e., access on the day of the hearing). If this happened, this would be jurisdictional error by the judge and an issue material to the appeal and possibly another forum.

The refusal to investigate is especially troubling in light of the activity with respect to the Federal Court's website on the weekend after CAS received my January 8, 2018 letter. In light of my request that there be preservation of the information sought, I assume that this activity has not altered the record or the ability to investigate.

Your refusal to investigate or provide the information sought leads my client to pursue other avenues of obtaining the information sought. He will be making an access to information request for this information. He will be bringing a motion to the Court of Appeal to access and release this information. If neither of these avenues are fruitful, I expect that my client will bring a mandamus and *Charter* application against the Federal Court of Canada itself requiring the disclosure of this information.

However, I would rather not put everyone through such bother, time and expense. Accordingly, I again request that you produce to me:

- The dates and times of all Federal Court access to DonaldBest.ca and other websites containing information relating to my client's judicial review application and associated persons and entities.
- The MAC (Media Access Control) address number for each internet device used.
- The name of the person(s) logged into the Federal Court of Canada network and computers used to perform the online research.
- The reasons that each Federal Court of Canada person conducted the online research, what information was viewed and/or downloaded, to whom such information was distributed and how the information was eventually utilized.



He also sued various parties, including the DRPS in 2013-2015. This lawsuit included an attempt to amend the Statement of Claim to name the DRPS Board, the former Chief of the DRPS and yourself, personally. The lawsuit was dismissed and the appeal of the dismissal was dismissed due to an inability to provide security for costs.

Pursuant to his rights under s. 2(b) of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, he has set up a website that deals with a number of issues, including the foregoing litigation. This website has links to various documents, including transcripts and court documents, some of which relate to proceedings before the Honourable Mr. Justice Shaughnessy. It is also a matter of public record that a judicial review has been filed to challenge a dismissal of a complaint filed by my client by the Canadian Judicial Council made against Justice Shaughnessy.

My client is a former Toronto Police officer and private investigator. He has determined that his website has been accessed and documents have been downloaded on May 31-June 3 in respect of documents relating to Justice Shaughnessy for approximately 7.5 hours from 3 different DRPS computers. Documents that make this clear are enclosed:

1/ An Excel spreadsheet showing in detail, visits to the DonaldBest.CA website from IP (Internet Protocol Number) 66.163.5.113, which is permanently assigned to the Durham Regional Police.

2/ A .pdf simplified printout of the visits to the DonaldBest.CA website from IP (Internet Protocol Number) 66.163.5.113 (Durham Regional Police).

3/ Results of a 'WhoIs?' report on IP (Internet Protocol Number) 66.163.5.113, showing that the IP number is permanently assigned to the Durham Regional Police.

My client is concerned about why this is taking place. He has committed no crime. Why is the DRPS investigating him or his website? He feels intimidated by these actions. In light of the past 'off the record' investigation by the DRPS, that he was advised of by Detective Rushbrook, my client is concerned that this may not be an official DRPS investigation.

Accordingly, please advise:

- Is there a DRPS sanctioned investigation of my client or his website?
- If so, what is the nature and purpose of this investigation? My client may be willing to discuss whatever issues that may be of interest to the DRPS with DRPS officers.
- If not, my client is requesting that a DRPS investigation be commenced as to the unauthorized use of DRPS resources (equipment; computer access and manpower) to investigate him. If the investigation of my client was not authorized, this would seem to be a violation of the *Police Act* and/or the *Criminal Code*.

In any case, please take steps to preserve records and data in respect of these actions.


